

I learned to take care of myself, put myself first, put my recovery first in order for me to be able to live my life fully. I didn't have that love from my mom and my dad, but I had that love from people that I met in the in the rooms of ACW.

So be patient, love yourself, and with time, your life will change. I was able to have full custody back of my daughter. I have three years and counting of clean time.

I have been able to get off probation. I have a life worth living today. And it's all thanks to having that solid foundation at ACW.


