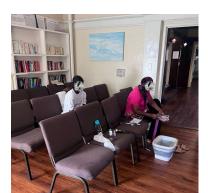
Labor Day Fun 🌼

Rose came to ACW in late 2021 at the encouragement of her sponsor. What she found was more than treatment - it was a community that helped her understand herself in new ways. She shared how learning about addiction as a disease that "speaks in your own voice" was eye-opening and helped her begin to heal from past trauma she hadn't connected to her substance use before.

During her time at ACW, Rose learned about accountability, friendship, and growth - even turning a tough moment with another resident into a lasting friendship. "It's crazy to think that three years later, we're still friends. It shows you can overcome anything - people, places, and things," she reflected.

Today, Rose lives in Beverly Hills, works as a business manager in the music industry, and continues to stay active in Narcotics Anonymous as both a sponsor and sponsee. "I rebuilt my life completely since leaving ACW - I have a home, a car, credit, and peace. I have ACW to thank for that."

Her advice to others:

"Don't give up on yourself. Give it a real shot and stay vigilant once you leave. It's not easy, but the rewards are beyond what you can imagine."

Rose's story reminds us that recovery is possible - and life after ACW can be full of purpose, success, and joy.
