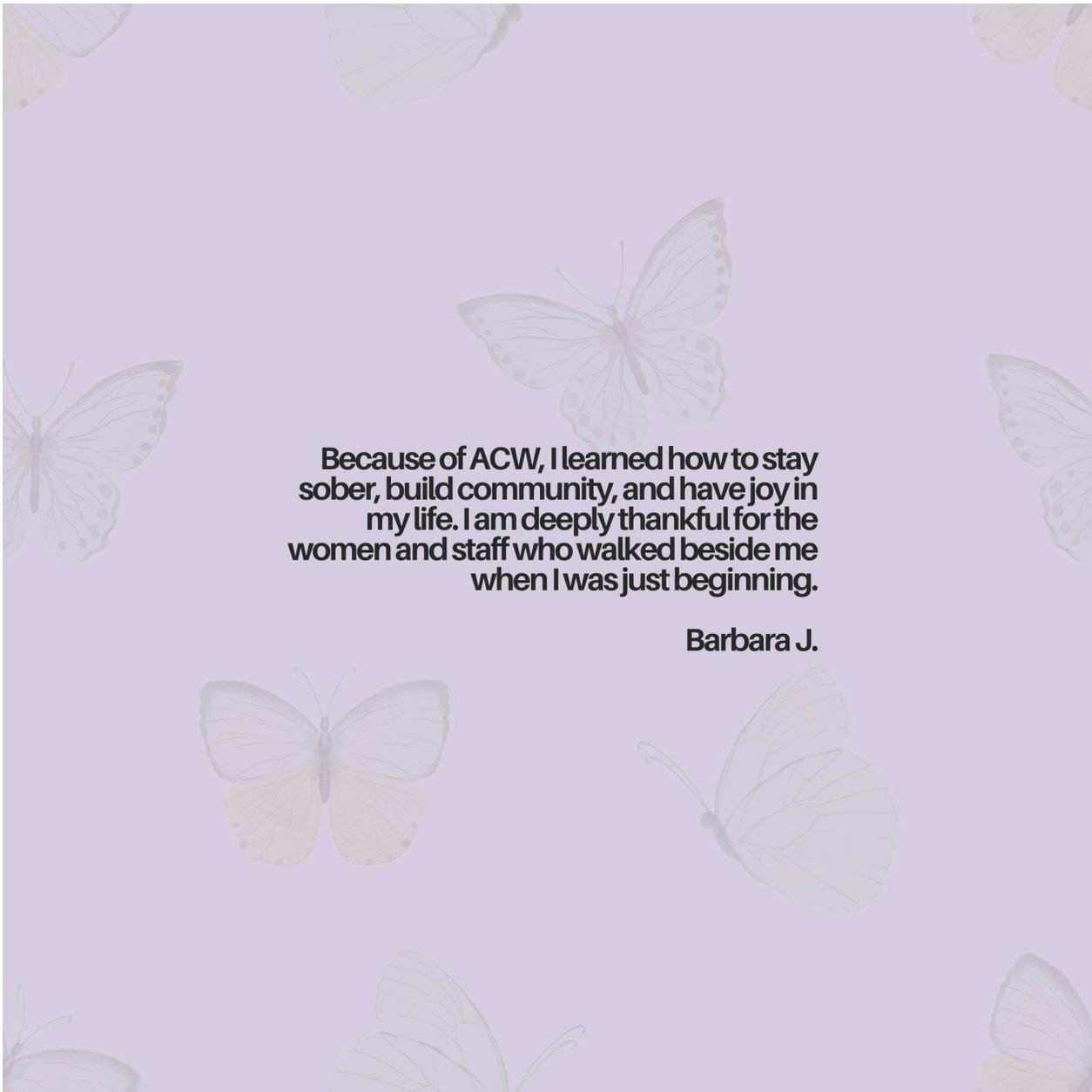
ACW supported me through some of the hardest moments of my life. The compassion and guidance I received helped me heal and reminded me that honesty and support truly saves lives.

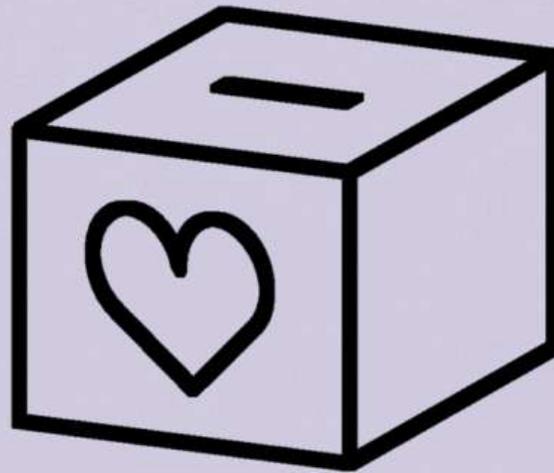
